Plus Est En Vous - There Is More In You

The Gordonstoun motto is as relevant today as it was when Dr Kurt Hahn a visionary German educationalist and founder of Gordonstoun, created it. He believed that young people flourish when their horizons are broadened beyond just their academic potential.

Dr Kurt set out to develop the qualities of compassion, honesty, initiative, a thirst for adventure and a sense of service to others in them. His intention was not just to prepare his students for exams, but also for life. This approach to character education is still achieved at Gordonstoun by combining inspiring classroom learning with an exciting and richly varied range of out of classroom learning experiences.

Life at Gordonstoun

All students at Gordonstoun take part in our world beating outdoor education and sail training programme, team and individual sports, explore the performing arts, and participate in one of the School's nine services to the community. These widely differing challenges instil a can-do attitude in our pupils and give them the ability to adapt to new situations quickly and confidently; skills which are essential in later life.

Our young people are also encouraged to take on roles of responsibility from their earliest years in the School and they rise to the challenge, developing an understanding and respect for the wider world.

Our students live in a close-knit community that is one third Scottish, one third from the rest of the UK and one third from the rest of the world, so they live and work alongside others from over forty countries. Consequently, our students are diverse in culture, faith, aptitude and background and we take pride in our global community and the opportunity it brings to develop a deep and accepting understanding of people from all walks of life and all nations.

Curriculum

At Gordonstoun, we believe that a broader curriculum broadens not only minds but opportunities too. It is a belief that's served both us and our students well for over 80 years and that has made Gordonstoun the world leader in character education. Our uniquely broad curriculum provides challenge in the classroom, on the sea, on the mountain, on the stage, and on the sports field. It is unrivalled in breadth, and helps every child to achieve their full potential.

Teaching

There's no secret to what we do: it's simply world-class teaching and lots of hard work. That's why inspectors from Education Scotland described our academic success as an 'important strength' and noted that staff 'have a relentless drive to ensure that each young person achieves their full potential'.

We focus on each student's personal academic goals and targets, understanding their strengths and abilities to help them discover the truth in our motto 'Plus est en vous' (There is more in you). Our broad curriculum gives every child the chance to explore what's important to them, to find out what they excel at. By giving students new experiences, their understanding of themselves and what they are capable of grows along with their sense of achievement.

Our impact

We believe that a broader curriculum broadens minds and that learning happens both inside and outside the classroom. We have understood the benefits of out-of-classroom learning experiences for over 80 years; however, no research had been done to quantify the true value of our character-building broader curriculum. Until now. In 2016 we commissioned Dr Simon Beames, from the Moray House School of Education at the University of Edinburgh, to carry out a study designed to understand the lasting influences of these experiences. He found that 94% of respondents said that out-of-classroom learning experiences had an overwhelmingly positive influence on their personal growth and 74% said it helped them on their career path.

Boarding

Gordonstoun is one of the UK's last remaining full boarding schools, co-educational for $4\frac{1}{2}$ -18 years old and dedicated to delivering an ethos which stretches, challenges, nurtures and develops every child in our care, so that they grow into all that they can be.

Location

Gordonstoun's physical location in the North of Scotland is another thing that sets the school apart. We are located in a beautiful and safe, 200-acre woodland campus in the heart of the Moray countryside, just moments from the sea and the hills. Our peaceful location is quiet, yet accessible and we have great international transport links – we are only 31 miles from Inverness and 65 miles from Aberdeen airport.



Encouraging students to work together achieves better results for everyone, both inside and outside the classroom. Each child develops the confidence to rise to challenges wherever they find themselves, whether tackling a difficult equation, tricky mountain or choppy ocean.

They develop the capacity to plan, negotiate, compromise and consider, to take orders and follow them, to make suggestions and follow those too. And in doing all this they also learn invaluable leadership skills.

The world is not only at our students' feet, it is all around them here at Gordonstoun. One of our fundamental aims at Gordonstoun is to give students a global perspective. It starts when they join a culturally diverse community of students from over forty nationalities. Internationalism is reinforced through the academic curriculum which includes a specially designed course in International and Spiritual Citizenship (ISC).

This course covers topics such as spiritual development, health education, environmental issues and life skills in an international context. Working with classmates from different backgrounds and values helps our students develop acceptance, understanding and tolerance. There are also many opportunities for senior students to experience life abroad either through Round Square, international exchange or international service projects.

Job Purpose:

Gordonstoun has been leading the way in character education for more than 80 years. Our uniquely broad curriculum provides challenge in the classroom, at sea and in the mountains, on the stage and on the sports fields and enables students to discover the truth in our motto – Plus Est En Vous – there is more in you.

Gordonstoun is an all-abilities school, renowned for valuing and developing the individual strengths of each child. Building on the excellent work done by our departments of Learning Support and EAL, we are now establishing an overarching Student Support Department to encompass both areas. Our aim is to ensure we remain at the forefront of best practice in ensuring every child achieves their full potential through a range of strategies and interventions, both on a targeted and whole-school basis.

The new Head of Department will be an experienced practitioner in either Learning Support or EAL with the vision and drive to develop a sector-leading integrated approach. Ideally the successful candidate will want to play a full role in boarding school life,

Major responsibilities

- To lead the Student Support Department to a sectorleading position in supporting student achievement
- To be the school's expert in either Learning Support or EAL (delivering exemplary teaching in that discipline) and to manage a Lead Teacher in the other discipline
- To curate a programme of group lessons, individual sessions and non-timetabled support (including chargeable sessions) in Learning Support and EAL
- To commission, conduct and implement follow-up on learner assessments as required
- To work with the Director of Student Development and other staff as appropriate to ensure appropriate stretch and challenge, for example by way of a Gifted and Talented programme

- To work with the Admissions department regarding student recruitment, including liaising with prospective families and feeder schools
- To monitor students with EHCP targets and hold annual reviews (where applicable)
- To manage, support and develop staff within the Student Support Department to fulfil their individual potential in support of student achievement and wellbeing
- To ensure all School policies and information in relation to Learning Support and EAL are up-to-date and reflect sector best practice
- To ensure all exam board regulations are complied with and to manage access arrangements for students in lessons and examinations
- To work with school leaders to ensure all staff are equipped to support all learners throughout the school, including through the provision of Learner Profiles, support plans and training
- To maintain outstanding relationships with parents in support of their child's education and wellbeing
- To maintain effective links to support the department, including but not limited to with other departments in the school, exam boards, professional bodies, universities and other schools
- To attend meetings, manage resources, and produce such reports and information as are necessary from time to time
